A facility of one main centre in Sana with six other satellite centres in different districts, all with physical accessibility features.

Accountability

Policy and procedures are **documented and demonstrated**.

<u>Quality</u>

There is a **committee for inspection and follow-up**, composed of three members who are **not in the board** of the organisation.

It is an **innovative and inspirational organisation** that addresses a critical problem in Yemen. The organization has **effective networking** with the **concerned local authority and the international bodies** and **efficiently utilises its financial resources**.
